Milford Eagles Game Day Protocol

Board Members and Volunteers:

- Masks must be worn at all times.
- Concessions volunteers must wear masks and gloves at all times.
- Ensure that spectators follow the one-way traffic patterns when entering and exiting the stadium.
- Responsible for sanitizing handrails and high contact areas in between games.

Parents and Spectators:

- All spectators must conduct daily symptom assessments. Any spectators who feel ill or have any COVID-19 related symptoms should stay home and not attend any athletic events.
- Masks are required to be worn by ALL spectators at all times. Social distancing guidelines must be followed accordingly.
- No congregating before or after games is permitted.
- Family groups are permitted to sit together in groups of 4 or less and should remain 6ft away from the nearest spectator.
- All Milford Athletic facilities will be marked with an Eagle decal designating where spectators are required to sit. All seating markers will be in groups of 4 or less. Only members of the same family/household may sit together. All designated areas will ensure fans are socially distant (6ft from other fans) at all times. All fans MUST practice social distancing at all times while at any MEF&C event.
- All away spectators must sit in designated visiting seating areas. Signs will clearly mark this.
- All Milford spectators must sit in designated home seating areas. Signs will clearly mark this.
- At-risk individuals are encouraged to stay home.

Coaches/Players/Cheerleaders:

- Opposing teams on competition day will undergo a verbally screened self-symptom check prior to arrival at the visiting venue and verbal documentation will be provided to MEF&C.
- MEF&C coaches will take player temperatures prior to game time and record for reference.
- All coaches must wear a mask entering and exiting the stadium.
- Cheer coaches masks must remain on the entire time.
- Football coaches may remove masks once the game has started.
- Players do not need masks on while entering/exiting or on the sidelines as long as helmets remain on during those times.
- Coaches need to do their best to socially distance players on the sidelines.
- Cheerleaders must wear masks when not cheering or socially distanced.
